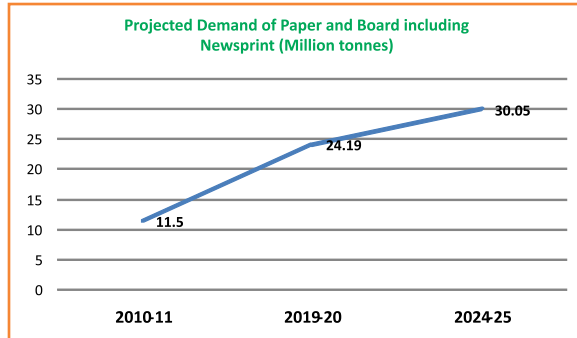

## Indian Paper Industry – An Outlook

The Indian Paper Industry has traversed a long way since 1812, when the first paper mill in the country was commissioned in West Bengal in meeting the ever growing requirements of consumers within the country and abroad. Today India produces a wide range of paper and paper boards using a variety of raw materials. Indian Paper Industry, comprising of more than 779 paper units, is highly fragmented and dominated by small and medium scale units with capacity ranges from 20-50 metric tonnes to 3000 metric tonnes per day. With the globalization of Indian economy, foreign equity participation has become attractive. The industry is on the growth trajectory and is projected to produce 22 million tons in the year 2019-2020 and will reach 30 million tons by 2024-2025.

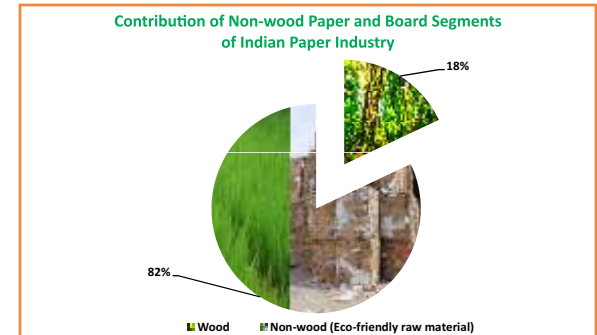
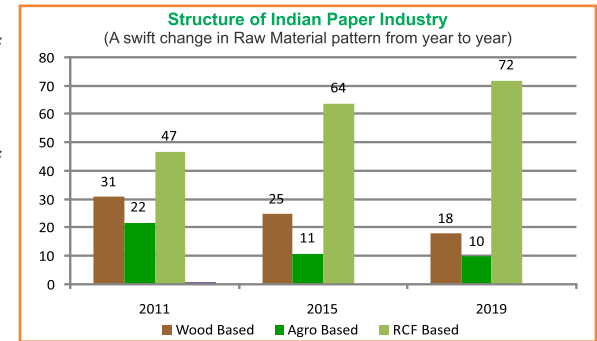

### History

**The Indian Agro & Recycled Paper Mills Association** popularly known as IARPMA (previously known as “Indian Agro Paper Mills Association”), is the apex body of Paper Mills based on Non-Conventional Raw materials viz Agricultural Residues like Rice Straw, Wheat Straw, Bagasse, Jute, Cotton Linter, Grasses and Wastepaper (Recycled Fibre) etc. and functions as a catalytic agent for the growth, promotion and development. The Association came in existence in 1987 at a historic meeting of the representatives of the Paper Mills based on agricultural residues and the organization as “Indian Agro Paper Mills Association” was born and later it is changed into “**Indian Agro & Recycled Paper Mills Association**” (IARPMA) by adopting the recycled paper segment under its folder. Thanks to the support and co-operation of our members, within a short span of time, the Association has been able to carve out a prominent place for the agro residue & recycle fibre based paper mills within the country and in the International arena. Today the non-wood based segment of the industry contributes nearly 82% to the total production in the Country.

### IARPMA Membership – An Ambassador to Eco-friendly Paper Production

IARPMA membership comprises of firms, companies, and other corporations engaged in the manufacturing of non-wood based Paper, Paper Board and allied products by the pulp made out of the Grass, Straw, Bagasse, Jute, Jute waste, Cotton Linters, Waste Paper etc. The formation of IARPMA has instilled confidence among the agro & recycled fibres based paper mills in the country and are striving hard to help the country to reduce dependence on scarce forest resources for paper making. The activities of the Association are also changing and broad basing in line with changing matrix of the industry. The doors of IARPMA are open to those who would like to be Ambassadors of this cause nationally and Internationally.

### Horizon of Activities – to make industry competent

IARPMA, although represents non-wood sector of paper mills in the country, it always endeavours to bring all the segments of the Paper manufacturers as well as Machinery & Equipment manufacturers, chemical suppliers, service providers, consultants etc. under one umbrella and also to facilitate linkage within the supply-chain management. - ❖ Bringing closer to all segments of pulp, paper and allied industry under one umbrella.

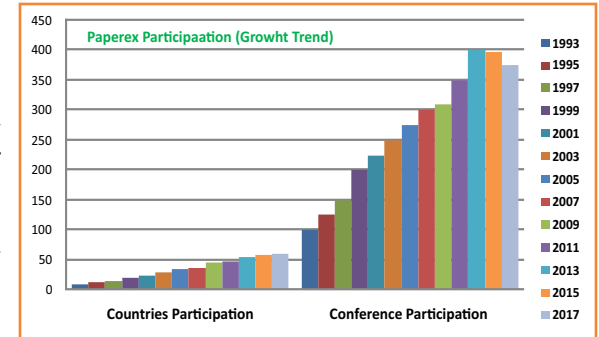
